### Classroom Focus for November

#### Mrs. Donnelly's & Mrs. Seed's JK/SK Class:

Continuing to learn about patterning through books, singing songs with repetitions and organizing objects. Starting to discuss Zones of Regulation and spending time identifying emotions associated with each zone.

Mrs. Leeder's (a.m.) and Mrs. Seed's (p.m.) SK/1 Class: Beginning small group work in language to focus on specific areas of need and reading development. Continuing to develop number sense in Math. As a class, we are focusing on key life skills such as independence, responsibility, and self-regulation.

Mme. Scanlon Strotmann's Gr. 2/3 Class: Continuing to do great work on UFLI reading. They wrote wonderful Spooky narratives and will now explore some non-fiction writing in expository form about the animal they are researching in Science. In Math we continue to study number and fractions and will start some graphing activities. Further discussion of Indigenous issues will occur with Danka Brewer.

Mrs. Smith's Gr. 3/4 Class: Working to complete projects on Living Things and Habitats before moving on to Earth and Space Systems (gr. 3) and Matter and Energy (gr. 4). Our work on early life in Canada will segue into People and Environments in different regions in Canada. We have started our unit on Financial Literacy focusing on money concepts. Within our classroom community, we are reminding ourselves and each other of the importance of kindness, always.
